ties arose in the county of Kings; a temperance section of the Conservative party were unfavorable to the candidature of my hon. friend and as the election drew near, and as it began to be apparent that it was a difficult matter to solidify the different forces of the party in support of my hon. friend, the hon. gentleman withdrew from the contest, doing so in a perfectly correct way by sending a letter to Mr. Bennett, president of the Conservative association, saying that in consequence of divisions in the party it was not desirable that he should continue in the field, saying: I hand back unsaluted into your hands the banner which the Liberal-Conservative party did me the honor of placing in my hands. He added further: I do not withdraw from the contest because of any difference of opinion with the Liberal-Conservative party of Canada whose trade policy I believe is essential to the prosperity

and good of this country, but in order that they may unite on another candidate whose chance of election may be greater than mine. Then the hon. gentleman, returning to St. John, when the elections approached, allowed himself to be nominated for the county of an independent party in the city. My hon. friend has not been quite candid in telling the House the reasons for his nomination and the platform on which he stood. In the year before, 1895, largely through the efforts of the gentlemen who with me were representatives of the constituency of St. John, a subsidy had been granted for the first time in the history of the community, the result of which was that we had a direct line of steamers connecting with the Canadian Pacific railway from the port of St. John to Liverpool. The hon. gentleman came back to St. John, and the issue in that election was the Manitoba school act and the action of the Conservative party in attempting to pass a remedial bill for the purpose of doing what I at that time candidly believed and believe yet was simply a measure of justice to the minority in the province of Manitoba. That was the one question. In the campaign, my hon. friend has said that he ran as a protest against the way St. John had been treated in connection with steamboat subsidies and the way in which the port had been neglected, but he failed to tell the House of the effective part of the platform in which he ran and that which got him the few votes he obtained—because he lost his deposit.

Mr. Pugsley.—What happened to my hon. friend?

Mr. Hazen.—I was defeated. But although in the city of St. John there were three candidates, it has always been a pleasure to me that I came out at the head of the poll, being defeated only by a few votes in the county. That is neither here nor there, I have never thought it any

matter of disgrace for a public man to go down to defeat so long as he does it standing on a platform to which he adheres, and of which he honestly approved. The hon. gentleman appealed for support on that platform of hostility to the Remedial Bill, and standing side by side with him at the joint meeting on the hustings he told a large audience that while he had little confidence in the Conservative policy on that question he had no confidence whatever in the hon. gentleman whom he now calls his leader and therefore he could not support him in the contest. Therefore, I regret that the hon. gentleman appealed to me in this connection as I do not wish to say anything of a fensive but I think I am right in saying that when the hon. gentleman

gave the reasons why he left the Conservative party in 1896 he did not give the whole reason and he was not quite candid in the explanation he gave the House.

But I might add that within three weeks after the 23rd of June when the elections were held my hon. friend, who on nomination day had no confidence in the party led by the hon. leader of the opposition, was the most staunch and noble Liberal of them all. Now, Sir, I was surprised tonight to hear my hon. friend indulge in a jeremiad with regard to the condition of affairs in the province of New Brunswick. One would almost have thought from his utterances, so different from his usual utterances, that the people of New Brunswick were in a down-trodden and depressed condition, that business was bad, that they were a poverty-stricken people, without hope and with no share in the prosperity of the country. I might have expected that from some other hon. gentleman, but it is hard to understand it coming from my hon. friend. Year in and year out in the legislature when I was leading the opposition, for a time a very small one, to the government of which my hon. friend was a distinguished and prominent member, we were delighted when we heard read from the Throne by the lieutenant governor sentences telling how prosperous the province was, and how well the people were, all due to the good government of my hon. friend and leader of the opposition was giving to the people here at Ottawa. I am surprised too because during the last two years ending on

FIND WINTER NESTS OF BROWNTAIL MOTHS

A search for the Brown tail moth will be made this winter through the St. John Valley, as well as in Charlotte county. J. D. Tothill, of Ottawa, who has been placed in charge of this work in New Brunswick by Dr. Hewitt, the Dominion entomologist, arrived in the city yesterday after a visit to Fredericton, where he was in conference with the secretary of agriculture, W. W. Hubbard. In company with provincial horticulturist Turner, Mr. Tothill made a tour of inspection of some of the orchards near Fredericton and unfortunately discovered two of the winter nests of the dreaded Brown tail on trees at Burton.

He wired to Dr. Hewitt that it will be necessary to make a most thorough inspection of the whole St. John Valley this winter in addition to the field work in the area in Charlotte county, where the pest was found last season.

While here Mr. Tothill will confer with Wm. McIntosh, prominent entomologist, and arrange a plan of campaign. Arrangements have been made between the Dominion and Provincial Agricultural Departments for co-operation in the work, each department supplying an equal number of workers. The scouting will begin on the island of Grand Mann, and the inspectors after covering the various islands off the coast, will examine the mainland in Charlotte county. Mr. Tothill will advise the sender whether or not the nest is that of the Brown Tail or exactly what it is, valuable aid in ascertaining the districts where the pest exists may be given the field force.

It is proposed to establish a station for the breeding and distribution of parasites which keep the pests in check, at some point in the province, and everything possible will be done to assist the Dominion and Provincial departments of agriculture to protect the country from the scourge.

The Provincial department has for some years been taking precautionary measures and two years ago had colored plates prepared showing the winter nests of the moth and the caterpillar in all their stages. These plates with information on the matter were embodied in last year's agricultural report of which 8,000 were distributed. Wall cards were also prepared and sent to the schools in the southwestern portion of the province, where their natty uniforms.

They were found in a local hotel. The persons in charge of them are believed to have escaped. It is supposed the munitions seized were to be used in an impending revolt in Mexico.
