ally Killed 1, total 23. Eight mar-
riages and nineteen births, of which ten
were females, were reported during

THE GENERAL SYNOUD CLOSED ON SATURDAY

Next Session Will Be Held in Winnipeg in 1920 Unless Lambeth Conference Dates Conflict.

Toronto, Sept. 21.—Matters of minor importance occupied the attention of the Anglican synod at the closing sessions today, and prorogation was made by the primate early in the evening. Unless the dates conflict with the Lambeth conference in England, the next general synod will be held in Winnipeg in 1920. This is the centenary of the ecclesiastical province of Rupert's Land. An interesting decision was made Saturday by the House of Bishops, in connection with the proposal of the Bishop of Ontario that an alternative form of evening prayer be authorized for use in such circumstances.

The upper house announced that while they were in complete sympathy with the proposal, they would not recommend that authorization be granted by insertion of a rubric in the book of common prayer. The matter will receive their consideration with a view to meeting the request of the Bishop of Ontario.

Judge McDonald, Brockville, resigned the trusteeship of the synod and L. A. Hamilton, Toronto, was appointed to succeed him. Many of the clergy from different points left for their homes Friday and a large number left by train Saturday morning. Members of the various committees were in town over the week-end and several matters referred to such bodies still awaiting decision.

Rev. Canon Henney, Winnipeg, appealed for the conducting of the session in Winnipeg. He thought that it would be advisable to hold the assembly at a time harmonizing with the centenary of the church in the ecclesiastical province of Rupert's Land which falls in 1920.

Chancellor Pridson, Montreal, in seconding the motion said that the holding of the synod in Manitoba would be singularly appropriate as the life of the General Synod was commenced in Winnipeg. The motion was carried unanimously.

Rev. Canon Tucker, London, Ont., read the names of nine members of the synod who have died since the last general synod. They included Rev. Canon Powell, Halifax.

In succession to Judge McDonald, Brockville, L. A. Hamilton, Toronto, was appointed to the synod treasurer's office by a unanimous vote.

A letter was read from the judge announcing his resignation from the position, and a resolution of appreciation was carried unanimously.

The House of Bishops announced that while in complete sympathy with the proposal of the Bishop of Ontario, for the authorization of a single form of service to be used in special circumstances instead of the order for evening prayer, they do not recommend that this authorization should be embodied in the book of common prayer.

They will take the matter into consideration with a view to meeting the need for such a service.
