The New Brunswick Electric Power Commission.

TENDERS will be received by the above named Commission up to noon 21st day of September, A. D. 1920, for the following work:

(1) The construction of an earth dam across the East Branch of the Musquash River, including Spillway, intake, bypass, etc., and the grading of a bed to carry a penstock from the damsite to the power house.

(2) The construction of an earth dam across the West Branch of the Musquash River, including the items named above, together with the construction of a canal and the grading for the penstock from the damsite to the power house above mentioned.

(3) The construction of an earth dam across the Sagouane River, including items named above, together with the construction of a canal and grading for the penstock from the damsite to the power house.

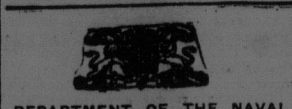
