

GOSSIP AROUND THE MARKETS

New York funds in Montreal are displaying a strong tone, sales having taken place at 12 1/2 per cent and the quotation now standing at 12 1/2-13 1/2 sterling in New York. Demand 184.75, cables 3.27 1/2, sterling in Montreal demand 3.75 1/2.

The annual statement of the Dominion Park Company, Limited, at Montreal shows the year just closed to have been a banner one. Gross revenue was \$341,064, an increase of \$18,424 over the previous year. Net earnings were \$127,800 against \$114,513.

On the 10th at New York British Empire Steel common is offered at 21 and the 7 per cent preferred at 41.

Montreal Cottons Ltd. has declared a dividend of 1 3/4 per cent, preferred common 1 3/4, payable December 15 to 20, 1920. 30 and Ogilvie Flour Mills Ltd. 1 3/4 per cent, payable December 1st, to record November 23.

On the Montreal department of the Montreal Exchange, transactions have taken place in New Britain at 30, New Bedford at 23, Whiston pref. at 25, North American Ship at 24, Dryden at 24 3/4 and Cuba Canadian pref. at 25. Cuba Canadian Common is quoted at 25 to 26 and Trans Power at 19 to 11 1/2.
