

IRELAND'S FUTURE PROSPERITY DEPENDS IN SUPPLYING FOOD TO GREAT INDUSTRIAL CENTRES

Country's Advantage is in Agriculture, and the Greatest Possibilities for Industrial Development Lie in Manufacture of Foodstuffs from Home Grown Materials.

Ireland's future prosperity lies primarily in supplying food to the great industrial centers and consuming markets of Great Britain and the continent, the National Bank of Commerce says in the January number of its magazine, Commerce Monthly.

The predominance of agriculture is indicated by the fact that in 1913, the last year for which values of Irish exports are available, 41 per cent of the total was made up of articles of an agricultural character, while agricultural products of indubitable domestic origin formed approximately half the total.

Live stock raising is by far the most important industry in Ireland and live animals the greatest single item of export. For the most part the stock is raised for the English market and is exported alive.



Evidence Heard in Case of Attempting to Murder — Prisoner Pleaded Not Guilty

The preliminary hearing of William Parry, charged with attempting to murder J. I. Jacobson in his store on Dec. 31, was continued in the police court Saturday morning and, after the evidence of Mr. Jacobson was taken, the case was postponed until today.

Mr. Jacobson testified that the accused had come into his store on Dec. 31 and looked at some furniture, telling the witness that he expected to be married shortly. After some discussion regarding the price of the goods and how they were to be paid for, the accused left the store, saying he would be back the next day to make the first payment. He returned on Saturday evening and was taken upstairs to look at the goods. After looking around, they started downstairs, the witness leading, when suddenly the latter heard a click and turning, saw the prisoner with a revolver in his hand. He then told Parry to proceed him, and they went to the lower floor.
