A Plague Stricken City. The telegraph brings only meagre details of the terrible sufferings endured by the citizens of the stricken city of Memphis, now under the scourge of the yellow fever epidemic. Stories of suffering and inhumanity that would touch the stoutest heart are almost beyond number. All the undertakers in the city are busily and constantly engaged, and funerals have come of the order and decorum usually considered as due to the occasion. People die faster than they can be buried. It is known that bodies have lain uncoffined for until partially decomposed, and at one burial place the stench arising from the coffins awaiting interment is described as horrible. People not on the spot can form no idea of the deplorable state can form no idea of the deplorable state of affairs from written descriptions of the frightful condition of the city. It must be seen to be fully realized. There is yet a pitiful lack of competent nurses, and the Howard Association of New Orleans has been telegraphed for a further supply. Some of the physicians appear to have given up in despair and flight at the fearful carnage, and have fled the city. Still the majority remain, and are laboring day and night in the cause of humanity. The clergy of all denominations remain faithful to their work, and are doing all in their power to alleviate the suffering. The little girl who recently obtained a coffin, and named other sick ones in the hospital, is now dying of the fever, and hundreds of similar painful cases are daily reported. THE ASHANTEE WAR. It looks very much as if England was in for a costly expedition against the Ashantees, which is all the more vigorously opposed at home because Parliament has not been called together to sanction the expenditure, as was the case when the Abyssinian expedition was fitted out.

It cannot be said, however, that the British Government, having gone to war, has neglected to supply the fullest means of prosecuting it. If there is any mistake it will be rather the other way. It has been decided to make a railway, and rails, wagons, engines, and all sorts of material will be promptly despatched to the scene of action. A train, consisting of a traction locomotive, on suitable wheels, a tender and twenty-four wagons, is in course of delivery. Iron benches on wheels and other appliances for constructing steam saw-mills on the African station, have also been delivered with other machinery, to expedite the work of the artisans who will be employed on the expedition. Wire for telegraph purposes, many miles in length, is to be taken on board the *Donny*, now lying at Woolwich, and proper fittings will accompany them, but the telegraph posts will be provided in the native forests. To facilitate the conveyance of stores from the coast to the interior, the boats have been prepared with rings attached by which they can be slung on poles and so carried upon the shoulders, and 2,000 barrels of rice contrived this way are taken on board the *Donny*. The bulk of the rice is being taken on in bags, but these barrels, as soon as they are emptied, will be useful for water carrying. It is expected that three, instead of, as at first intended, two, regiments will be sent out. The final arrangements of the War office will be regulated by telegrams which are expected from Gen. Wolseley.
