Street railway motormen and conductors secured average increases of 94 per cent in hourly rates and 179 per cent in weekly rates. In steam railways the increase per diem and per mile for the six classes averaged 86.6 per cent, but it is pointed out that over-time rates for excess hours or mileage have been paid since January, 1918. This means a great increase in the rates as given.

The increase in factory wage scales over 1913 is very large. Index numbers of these rates show an average increase in common factory labor of 115 per cent in hourly rates since 1913, and 98 per cent in weekly rates.

CONVICT WANDERER OF DOUBLE MURDER

Peculiar Case Puzzled Chicago Police For Many Weeks.

CHICAGO, March 18 .- Carl Wanlerer today was found guilty by a jury of the murder of the "ragged stranger," shot to death in the alleged mock hold up, and the penalty fixed at death. Wanderer previously was convicted of the murder of his wife, shot to death at the same time as the stranger, and was sentenced to 25 years' imprisonment. The double murder took place last ummer. Wanderer declared that when he came home from a picture show one night with his wife they met a man in the vestibule at the entrance to their home. The man opened fire, Wanderer said, and he fired back. The stranger and Wanderer's wife were killed.

For several days Wanderer was looked on as a hero. The police, however, found that the stranger's gun belonged to Wanderer's cousin, and that Wanderer had borrowed it a few days before the murders. Wanderer was arrested and signed a confession that he had hired the stranger, whom he termed a "poor boob," to stage a fake hold-up, and had killed his wife and the man.

In his first trial, for the murder of his wife, and her unborn babe, Wanderer repudiated this confession. He was found guilty and given a 25-year sentence, the jury announcing that it had compromised on the punishment. he came home from a picture show one


