

HUNTINGTON, *Hon. LUCIUS SETH, Q.C.* [*Shefford.*]

B. at Compton, Q., 16 May, 1827. Ed. in Can. M. Miriam Jane, dau. of the late Major David Wood, of Shefford (she d. March, 1871). Called to the Bar, L.C., 1853. Created Q.C., 1863. Is Presdt. of the Huntingdon Mining Co., and Secy. of the Stanstead, Shefford and Chambly Railway Co. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council, Can., and S.-I.-Gen., L.C., from May, 1863, to March, 1864, when the Govt. resigned. Sat for present seat in Can. Assembly from 1861 until the Union. Contested Shefford unsuccessfully, 1860. Returned to Commons at last g. e. for present seat. A Liberal; opposed to the present Govt., and in favor of the Independence of Canada.—*Waterloo, Que.*; 1124 *St. Catherine St., Montreal*; *St. James' Club*; *Rideau Club*.

HURDON, FRANCIS, *J.P.* [*South Bruce.*]

S. of Mr. James Hurdon, Camelford, Cornwall, Eng. B. there, 18 June, 1834. Ed. at Wadebridge, Eng. M., May, 1857, Charlotte S., dau. of Mr. Richard Chubb, of Devon, Eng. (she d.) A grain merchant. Was a member of the Kincardine Council for two years, when he resigned. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. for present seat. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir John A. Macdonald.—*Kincardine, Ont.*
