Taking out Books.

108.—During a Session of Parliament, no Books belonging to the Library may be taken out of the Building, except by the authority of The Speaker, or upon receipts given by a Member of either House.

Library, during recess. 109.—During the Recess of Parliament, the Library and Reading Room remain open every day in each week, Sundays and Holidays excepted, from the hour of ten in the morning, until three in the afternoon; and access to the Library is permitted to persons introduced by a Senator or a Member of the House of Commons, or admitted at the discretion of The Clerk or The Librarian; subject to such regulations as may be deemed necessary for the security and preservation of the collection; but no one is allowed to take any Book out of the Library, except Members of Parliament, and such others as may be authorized by The Speaker of either House.

XIV .- UNION ACT AND ROYAL INSTRUCTIONS.

Printing of Union Act and Royal Instructions.

110.—The Union Act as well as the Royal Instructions to the Governor General of Canada respecting the passing of Bills by Parliament, which may be communicated to the Senate, are to be printed with the Rules and Standing Orders thereof.

XV .-- UNPROVIDED CASES.

Unprovided cases.

111.—In all unprovided cases, the Rules, Usages and Forms of Proceeding of the House of Lords are to be followed.
