ORDINANCE

ESTABLISHING FEES TO BE TAKEN

IN THE

PROVINCE OF NEW-BRUNSWICK.

By His Excellency Thomas Carleton, Esquire, Captain-General, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Province of New-Brunswick, Chancellor and Vice-Admiral of of the same, &c. &c.

In Council, this second day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty five.

There being no Law or Ordinance now in force for the Regulation of the Fees to be taken by the respective Officers in the Province of New-Brunswick, and it being necessary that a reasonable provision be made, and a Table of Fees ordained in due proportion to their services, in order that every one may know what is of right in each case to be demanded: In pursuance thereof His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and assistance of His Majesty's Council for said Province, hath thought fit to ordain and declare, and His said Excellency, by and with the advice and assistance aforesaid, doth hereby ordain and declare, that from and after the first day of April next ensuing no Officer or other person or persons whatsoever, for any service or services by him or them to be done or performed in their respec-
