On coming up to the Bar, with three obeisances, the Speaker goes down to the Bar and receives the Messages uncovered; the Message is then read and delivered to the Speaker by the Messenger. On his retiring, with three obeisances to the House, the Speaker resumes the Chair, and standing, uncovered, reports the Message for the information of the Members. The House then resumes the business it had before it.
