

York 23^d April 1828 -

Sir/

I have the honor to acknowledge
the receipt of your letters of the 12th and 15th
Instant.

As the Indians have been warned to
appear here by Tribes, and the Mohawks (as
the first Tribe) hourly looked for, I have
therefore despatched a messenger to countermand
the instructions, and to acquaint the Indians of
your intention to be present at the Grand River
when the Monies are to be paid to them under
your Order and in your presence.

I have the honor to enclose a copy
of a Letter from the Attorney General dated 12th Inst.
on the subject of the Bill alluded to in your
communication.
