Sir,

I have to direct your attention to official letters of the 31st ultimo, and 3rd instant. In the former letter you were requested forward the coupons of receipts required in connection with your July cash book return, which coupons should be signed by the persons from whom you received the money and to whom you issued the receipts. In the letter of the 3rd instant, you were asked to explain why you ~~had~~ did not send in your returns at the end of each month and why you held money collected in September in your hands for nearly five months. You will be good enough to comply with the Department's requirements ~~xxxxxxxx~~ as above indicated. The coupons of receipts in connection with the July cash book must be sent in without further delay and the Department also desires to receive the explanation above referred to.

Your cash book return for January, together with any moneys which you may have collected and the coupons of receipts issued, should have been sent in at the beginning of the present month. You must be aware that these returns are required for the Auditor General and that they must be properly completed.
