

ADDRESS BY THE PROSECUTOR

I would say two things. Did he obey or did he not obey. The Court has no right to inquire why he did not obey. The second point in the evidence shows the accused was given an order and did not carry out the order. This is the only thing the Court is concerned with.

The Court closes to consider a finding. *(The Schedule annexed to
convening Order)*

The Court re-opens and the prosecutor having been duly sworn, produces the accused's APB296, which is filed as Exhibit "F". A certified copy of the accused's WFM6 is produced and filed as exhibit "G".

In view of the trial, this man should be given everything possible to lighten his sentence. He has had no trouble in England and has been here a very short time which effect his behaviour. His sentence should be as light as possible in view of his age, which is thirty-eight.
