# CITY FIRE ALARM.

SIGNALS FOR WARDS.

Wellington Ward.-Being down as far as Northumberland street, one

St. Ann's Ward. - Being between Northumberland and York streets, Tap or one Whistle. two Taps or two Whistles.

Carleion Ward .- Between York and Regent streets, three Taps or three

Queen's Ward .- Retween Regent and Church streets, four Taps or Whistles.

King's Ward .- Being below Church Street, five Taps or five Whistles. four Whistles.

#### CITY ALARMS.

The City Alarms are -

1. Whistle on Engine House, Wellington Ward. 2. City Hall Bell, St. Ann's Ward, having electric attachment with gong at Water Works.

3. Methodist Church Bell, Carleton Ward. 4. St. Dunstan's Church, Queen's Ward, having electric attachment with gong at Water Works.

5. Bell on No. 5 Hose Station, and telephone to Water Works from house of J. Rodgers, opposite said Hose Station No. 5.

### HOW TO SOUND ALARM.

King's Ward.—In case of fire in King's Ward, the party sounding alarm will proceed to Rodgers' and telephone to Water Works, "Fire in King's Ward, and alarm will proceed to Rodgers' and telephone to Water Works, "Fire in King's Ward," and also to St. Dunstan's Church and strike alarm by ringing hard for about half a minute, then pausing about ten or fifteen seconds, and then tolling five by five distinct separate taps, then pausing ten or fifteen seconds, and then ring hard as before, and repeat the whole

Queen's Ward .- If fire in Queen's Ward, sound alarm on St. Dunstan's Church Bell in manner before described for King's Ward, except giving

only four Taps when tolling, in place of five.

Carleton and St. Ann's Wards.—If fire in Carleton or St. Ann's Wards, sound for Carleton three taps, and for St. Ann's two taps on City Hall Bell or St. Dunstan's Bell, as most convenient, giving the alarm on either

Bell or St. Dunstan's Bell, as most convenient, giving the alarm on either of said Bells, in same method as prescribed for King's Ward on St. Dunstan's Church Bell, with the exception of number of Taps tolled.

Wellington Ward.—If fire in Wellington Ward, proceed to Engine House (Water Works), where one long Whistle as a general alarm will be sounded for about fifteen seconds, then a pause of about five seconds, then a short Whistle of one second, then a pause of fifteen seconds, then the alarm as before. The Ward signal will always be given by short Whistles, following at intervals of one second, and lasting about one second each. second each.
