AN ORDER OF SERVICE

FOR PRIMARY CLASSES OR THE HOME LESSON

Fourth Quarter, 1910

I. RESPONSIVE EXERCISE.

Teacher. From whom do all our blessings come ?

Class. Every good and perfect gift cometh down from the Father in heaven.

Teacher. What is God's best Gift to us?

All. God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoseever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

II. SINGING. During the first half of this Quarter a thanksgiving hymn may be sung. Hymns 518 and 519, Book of Praise, are suggested.

III. SUPPLEMENTAL LESSON. Learn verse by yerse and repeat Scripture Memory Passage. For those under six, The Lambs of the Flock, Mark 10: 13-16. For those under eleven, The Heavenly City, Rev. 21: 1-7: 22: 41-5. (A pretty Certificate in colors is awarded for the correct recitation of all the verses in the List of Passages For Those Under Six; and a larger Certificate for the correct recitation of the complete List of Passages For Those Under Eleven.)

V. OFFERING. Sing (Tune 537, Refrain : Book of Praise),

Happy voices blending, Joyfully we sing ; Bringing willing off'rings, To our heavenly King.

VI. THE QUESTION ON MISSIONS FOR THE DAY. (See each Lesson.) The very little ones will not be expected to learn this by heart, but it may be repeated several times over, and any needed explanation given.

VII. SINGING. Hymn 539, Book of Praise, vs. 3, 4. (These are the last two verses of the Supplemental Hymn for the Half Year. The verses should be learned one by one. As the little ones sing them Sunday after Sunday, they will soon come to know them by heart.)
