THE JUNE BANK STATEMENT

The June Bank Statement which appears in full below contains a number of changes as contrasted with the May statement and also some striking changes as contrasted with the statement of June, 1913. The Note Circulation in June increased by \$2,500,000 over the figures for the preceding month, while Demand Deposits show the large increase of nearly \$15,000,000, and are now but \$7,000,000 less than they were a year ago. Deposits outside Canada increased by nearly \$8,000,000 over the returns for May.

On the side of Assets, there is a slight contraction in the Note Circulation but a gain in the amount of Specie. The amount due from Foreign Banks shows an increase of \$10,000,000, while the Call Loans outside Canada show a gain of \$8,500,000 over the figures for May and a gain of \$8,000,000 over the figures for June, 1913.

Loans to Municipalities increased by nearly \$4,000,000, indicating that the Banks are more disposed to listen to the claims of towns and cities for extensions and improvements. Total Assets increased during the month by \$30,000,000. In brief the June Statement shows that the banks are carefully husbanding their resources to provide for crop moving purposes.
