

That "*An Act to continue and amend an Act intituled an Act for regulating the Fisheries in the different Rivers, Coves and Creeks of this Province*" expired on the 1st February 1791.

That "*An Act to authorize the erection of Fences and Gates across certain Roads in the several Counties in this Province where the same shall be found necessary*" will expire in October 1791.—and—

That "*An Act for laying an Impost.*" will expire on the 1st March 1791.

Motion by Mr. Pagan. Mr. William Pagan moved for leave to bring in "*A Bill for the Relief of confined Debtors.*"

Leave was given.

And the said Bill being brought in.

Bill read. Was read the first time.

Committee appointed. Mr. Hardy, Mr. William Pagan, Captain Lyman, Mr. Glenie, Mr. Rogers, Mr. Robert Pagan and Major Coffin are appointed a committee to bring in "*A Bill for regulating the Fisheries in the different Rivers, Coves, and Creeks of this Province.*"

Committee appointed. Mr. Chipman and Mr. Hubbard are appointed a committee to bring in "*A Bill to continue an Act entitled 'An Act to authorize the erection of Fences and Gates across certain Roads in the several Counties of this Province where the same shall be found necessary'.*"

Motion by Mr. Chipman. Mr. Chipman moved for leave to bring in "*A Bill in amendment of an Act entitled 'An Act for laying out, repairing and amending Highways, Roads and Streets and for appointing Commissioners and Surveyors of Highways within the several Towns or Parishes in this Province,'*"

Leave was given.

On motion made and seconded,

Committee appointed. Ordered, That a committee, consisting of a member from each county, be appointed to bring in "*A Bill for fixing the Times and Places of holding the Sitzings of the Supreme Court in this Province.*" Mr. William Pagan, Mr. Dixon, Captain Clinch, Mr. Hardy, Major Murray, Major Coffin, Mr. Yeamans and Mr. Glenie are appointed for that purpose.
