the same amount will go three times as far. The finely powdered commercial form is cheaper and more easily applied by the dusting method than the fine crystallized sodium fluoride. Holding the fowl by the legs orwings one pinch of sodium fluoride is applied each to the head, neck, back, breast, below the vent, tail either high and under side of each wing. Sodium fluoride is rivitating to the nose and threat and will cause local irritation to the side. The applicant must guard against it, As a dip the sodium fluoride is harmless and more easily solved at the rate of three-fourths to one ounce of commercial powder or two hirds ounce of the chemically pure thirds ounce of commercial powder or two miles from Cambridge Station, one mile from Wooddland (known as the CERNAN NAVAL RABE DOWNERS).
