FRANK EATON
Mr. Frank Eaton, who died last week was buried under the auspices of the Oddfellows on Wednesday afternoon Rev. Dr. Bruce officiating. His death was caused by paralysis from which he had suffered the past four years. He leaves a widow, two sons, and a daughter, Mr. H. F. Eaton being the only one residing here. One son Roy was killed by accident in the Yukon a year ago. One daughter Mrs. Gates died in Truro about three years ago.

Mr. Eaton was prominent in the affairs of Colchester County. He was a County Councillor for upwards of twenty years a justice of the peace and a member of the Presbyterian church. Mr. H. Frank Eaton accompanied the remains to Truro after the funeral service held here on Monday last.

WILLIAM CRAZE
News has been received by cable that Mr. William Craze passed away on Monday, Aug 27. He died at his home in Huyton near Liverpool, England, at the age of 65 years. He was taken ill in April and had an operation performed later which seemed to be successful. But he never regained his full strength and gradually wasted away.

Mr. Craze was born at St. Ives in Cornwall and started on his own account at the age of 19 in the fruit business in Birmingham. Later he moved to Liverpool and has been identified with the fruit trade there ever since. When the Federated Fruit Merchants Association of Great Britain was formed he was elected their first president and served in that capacity two years. At the time of his death he was associated with the firm of Charles White & Hall, Ltd., of Liverpool, and was well known in the apple circles of Nova Scotia. He first came out in 1911 and, until last winter, was a familiar figure around Kentville every apple season. He visited the Valley a year ago for four or five weeks and when he left it was little expected by his relations and friends here that he was bidding them goodbye for the last time.

He was a life long teetotaler and non-smoker and a prominent worker in the Wesleyan Methodist Church. He was a local preacher in that body and preached most acceptably in many pulpits in Kentville and Kings County and a great Sunday School worker. In politics he was a Conservative, an admirer of the late Joseph Chamberlain and his policies. He was a fluent public speaker and was in great demand at election times.

His wife died in 1902 and he leaves four daughters and three sons to mourn his loss.

The children are Marie, wife of Capt. J. P. Thomas at present serving in India; Bessie, wife of Mr. S. B. Jackson, in charge of munition works in Liverpool; Mabel, wife of Mr. Michael Brown in the insurance business Liverpool, Miss Nellie teaching near Liverpool, William Craze, Jr., Lieutenant in England; Ernest of Port Williams in this County, and Stanley residing at Kentville.

Of his daughters Mrs. Brown was in Kentville in the summers of 1912 and 1913 and Miss Mabel resided with him here each year he kept house. He will not only be much missed in fruit growers circles but with many others with whom he became most intimately associated.

MR. S. C. PARKER, former Secretary of the N.S.F.G.A. was in town yesterday and in conversation stated that in his opinion there was little above half million barrel mark for apples in the Province this year. His fruit was clean and good but the prospects were now only about half they were some months ago. He ordered 3000 barrels for his crop at first and had reduced the order to 1500 barrels and felt sure that would be sufficient.
