**DEATH WARRANT**  
Hayward Must Pay the Penalty for his Crime

**CATHERINE KING'S MURDER**  
The Gambler Paid Brix \$2,000 to Get Her Out of the Way Sensational Development at the Trial.

St. Paul, Minn., Dec. 7.—Gov. Clough has signed the warrant ordering the execution of Harry T. Hayward, who was hanged for the murder of Catherine King, a pretty girl, on December 3, 1894, at a public square in Minneapolis, on Excelsior road, a few miles from the city. A \$2,000 bribe was paid to the governor to get Hayward out of the way. Hayward had killed the girl for \$2,000, promised him by Hayward, who desired to secure a \$100,000 insurance on Miss King's life, which had been assigned to him. Six days after the murder, Hayward was arrested. A full confession, implicating Hayward, was given by the latter. Hayward also confessed that Harry had hired him to kill the girl. There was a sensational development at the trial, when the father and mother of the condemned man appeared and made a tearful appeal for his life. The governor's office shortly before 10 o'clock this morning refused to interfere with the work of the court and jury.
