

SYNOPSIS OF COAL MINING REGULATIONS

Coal mining right of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the North-west Territories and in a portion of the Province of British Columbia may be leased for a term of wenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1 an agre. Npt more than 2,500 acres will be leased to one applicant. Applications for a lease must oe made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-agent in the dis-trict in which the rights applied for

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal sub-divisions of sections, and in un surveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the appli-

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5 which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available, but not otherwise. royalty shall be paid on the merchartable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton. The person operating the mine shall

furnish the agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining ights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at leas

once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only, but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10.00 an
