THE ROSS RIFLE.

COL. WURTELE CERTIFIED TO THE WORK DONE.

The Government Paid Upon His Certifi- cation—He Was Also Auditor for the Ross Company—Sir Charles Ross Paid Cash—British Magazines for Canada.

Ottawa, Jan. 15.—(Special.)—The Ross rifle business occupied the attention of the Public Accounts Committee to-day.

Lieut. Col. Wurtele was examined on an item of \$284,722 paid to the rifle com- pany. Being examined by Mr. Northrup, Col. Wurtele, a chartered accountant, said that during the summer of 1903 he was employed by the Ross Rifle Com- pany to make progress estimates for them. He did this work until September, 1907, when he was employed to make progress estimates for the Government.

He did no work for the Bank of Mon- treal. The bank recommended him for the position. As between the bank and the Ross Rifle Company he had nothing to do. He made the estimates, that was all. He had to do his duty, which was to certify that 75 per cent. of the work was done, and the Government paid upon that expenditure. The company made sporting rifles, and he deducted for these \$25 each before making his estimate. He was auditor for the Ross Rifle Co.

Mr. Wallace Nesbitt, C. appeared on behalf of the Ross Rifle Company. In answer to Mr. Nesbitt, the witness said that his duties as auditor were distinct from those of preparing estimates. Al- though the materials were mostly im- ported, there were some Canadian com- ponents. The practice of the company was to get the best value, and whatever money was loaned from the bank had nothing to do with the Government.

Mr. Bristol complained that Mr. Nes- bitt was leading the witness; was, in fact, giving the evidence.

Mr. Nesbitt warmly resented this. Mr. Macpherson said that they were there to get information.

Mr. Foster—That is a valuable state- ment.

In reply to Mr. Nesbitt the witness said that \$1,180,000 was paid by the Government in advances. Against this there were \$800,000 for completed rifles in the inspection department and 500 or thereabout assembled in parts. The material in the shops was worth about \$300,000. The witness added that in no case did he certify to the payment of more than 75 per cent. on any contract.

Intellectual Preference

Trade Commissioner Macpherson, of Bristol, in a report to the department, states that the increase of periodicals and magazines, under the intellectual pre- ference, has been very satisfactory. During October five or six million peri- odicals were sent to Canada.
