LONDON, Oct. 2.

Cable steamers 'Dacia' Ambassador and 'Faraday' arrived at Queenstown latter last Cable in gale of wind; engaged several days in attempting to recover it, but unsuccessful and obliged to return for coals.

A barge laden with four tons gunpowder exploded in Regent Canal near Zoological Gardens; five dead bodies found; a number of animals in Zoological killed. Perfect panic for several hours; several persons died from fright.

'Faraday' had paid out 1500 miles of Cable when it parted in 2,500 fathoms, in longitude 24; buoys placed to mark position.

Grand hotel at Saratogo destroyed by fire yesterday; loss 400,000 dol.

FROM LATE PAPERS.

LONDON, Sept. 28.

The Republicans are preparing to dislodge the Carlists from Sagardie.

All Communist prisoners will be removed from New Caledonia and Isle of Pines to the Island of Billeps.

Advices from Santander say that seven more German men of war are expected to arrive off the coast within a week.

Two thousand five hundred emigrants have arrived in the last three months in the province of Canterbury New Zealand.

Pesal left Serrano will soon take command of the Central Spanish army; meanwhile Gen Jovellar will replace General Paria.

Mount Etna is still in a state of agitation, and on Saturday an earthquake shook the mountain to its base and destroyed several houses in Rozanda.

The French corvette 'Le Hennite' was wrecked on Wallace Island. Aug. 29, and two of her crew drowned.

NEW YORK, 28.

The International Rifle Shooting Match at Creedmoor, on Saturday resulted in the success of American team by a total score of 934 to 931. Taken in the detail the Americans won by nine points at 800 yards, and the Irish by two and four points at 900 and 100 yards respectively.

THE PERILS OF THE SWISS ALPS.

Captain and Mrs. Lockhart of Scotland, have been striving for some time at Krone Hotel, Pontresina. Mrs. Lockhart, accompanied by two ladies whose acquaintance she had made at the hotel, left the Krone to ascend one of the heights adjacent, the beautiful Rosegg glacier. The object of the ascent was to secure the Edelweiss, the famous flower which grows only at a height of 8,000 or 10,000 feet above the level of the sea. Mrs. Lockhart slipped and fell over a perpendicular rock, and so on to precipice the mouth of which was stopped by a bush. Altogether the fall was about fifty or sixty feet. Her friends were separated from her and she was invisible, but her moans were audible. One of the ladies descended from her perilous position and ran breathlessly down the narrow road where she hailed a carriage in which were a young lady and two gentlemen.

The young lady declared that there was a lady killed on the rocks and implored the gentlemen of the party to hasten to discover the body. The Rev. Mr. LeFroy set out, outran the carriage and climbed up the face of the mountain came to the lady. By this time three Italian peasants came up, but they did not know what to do. Sir George Robinson followed, and some brandy having been administered to Mrs. Lockhart life seemed to return. She was fearfully out in the head and face, and the wounds were clotted with grass and hair. All that she could say was that her back was sore. Able guides speedily appeared, but the lady seemed sinking fast. At length after careful wrapping up and the administration of some brandy the helpless and unconscious lady was carried down to the roadside, where Captain Lockhart appeared with a resident medical man. A stretcher of canvas was provided and Mrs. Lockhart was borne to her room from the mountain by Mr C Barnett and the Rev. Mr. LeFroy. Mrs. Lockhart though seriously hurt and shaken, is not dangerously ill. She complains much of her back, but Dr Ludwig and Dr Drummond believe that with great care and quietness she recovery is all most certain.

The Irish riflemen who are now engaged in contesting with American marksmen at Creedmore, the national rifle range of the United States have met with a most hospitable reception. The fact of their being accompanied by

the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayorness of Dublin gives additional 'clat' to the demonstrations of their behalf. An illustration may be given of the manner in which attentions are being shown the party. Last Thursday evening they paid a visit to Booth's Theatre New York, and the announcement was sufficient to attract an immense assemblage. Crowds had assembled in the vicinity of the theatre and when the carriage rolled up to the door at eight o'clock a cheer arose that made the welkin ring. The Lord and Lady Mayorness and Viscount and Viscountess Massarene (who accompanied them) and the other members of the party were escorted to the respective seats of honor prepared for them, and meanwhile the theatre had become thronged to the very doors and the passage ways became entirely blocked up. Outside the theatre was appropriately adorned with flags but the interior presented an appearance seldom witnessed even on the most festive occasions. Satin banners representative of the American, Irish and English nations, handsomely interwoven, depended from the boxes, while in other parts of the house welcoming symbols were prominently displayed. As the party entered the audience rose 'en masse' and amid vociferous cheering and the waving of handkerchiefs the band struck up 'God save the Queen.' When this necessary part of the musical arrangements had been disposed of the lively strains of 'Garry Own' made every seat at home. To make sure of it however 'St. Patrick's Day' was thrown in but when 'Hail Columbia' succeeded their arose such a deafening shout that the very walls seemed to tremble.
