NOT TOO MUCH REFORM. In the Committee stage of the Aylsworth Election Bill, the Opposition offered an amendment for various clauses the object of which was to amend the bill.

That all contributions to election funds be paid to the legal agent of the candidate, who must furnish a sworn statement with vouchers giving every detail of election expenditures.

That contractors under government must be prohibited under severe penalties from subscribing to election funds.

That officers of the federal and provincial governments be prohibited under severe penalties from acting as agents for candidates, from canvassing, or engaging in any form of campaign activity.

These amendments were opposed by the Government and voted down. The Aylsworth Bill borrows from the Conservative platform the clause forbidding election subscriptions by corporations. But the Government draws the line at contractors. In these days of over-inflation opportunities, and of 900 per cent profits on Marine Department contracts, contributions from this source must not be shut out.

NOTES. Parliament has been sitting seven months, and is within two or three weeks of the end of the session, yet the Government has not brought down the supplementary estimates, which will probably contain several hundred items, and involves votes of ten to twenty millions.

The British Bay railway measure, calling for some \$18,000,000 appropriation, is also withheld.

Just financial returns show a continued falling off in the Dominion revenue. The amount for the first quarter of the fiscal year is more than 4,000,000 behind the same three months of 1907.

Canadian fallacies for the first six months of 1908 were 581, or more than 308 more than in the same period last year. The liabilities increased from \$6,456,428 to \$20,328,777.

The private secretary of the Minister of Marine has been telling the public accounts committee how Mr. Brown and his merry party managed to spend so much money on their "official" visit to Europe.

The secretary's own personal expenses ran up to \$1,956. He gave \$45 in one day in tips for the group. The party evidently moved in aristocratic splendor.

Ship Collapsed

A mammoth steamer on its trial trip in Buckley's Channel, recently ran 300 feet from the earth in view of 10,000 spectators, tilted, burst and collapsed to the ground with it over 15 men, every one of whom was injured.

With the possible exception of L. V. Brown, engineer, injured internally, all 15 men were severely hurt, with some more hurt than others. The accident was spectacular. A great concourse of men, women and children from Buckley's and Oshawa gathered around a field where a great aircraft had been built with illuminating gas. After much waiting, which made the onlookers impatient, the steamer was out from the earth. The five gasolene engines suspended from the long gas receptacle at intervals of about 50 feet, each actuated by an engine, were not operated on until the steamer was well up in the air. Then two of the engines slowly set in motion the long propellers reaching out from them on each side of the ship. Before the ship could be propelled further than a few feet the forward and tilted downward until the craft stood at an angle of forty-five degrees, nose downward. The members of the crew were apparently unable to run along the canvas pathway to equalize the weight and to right the ship, and they clung desperately to the netting and superstructure. The crash of the gas to the stern of the long gas bag caused the envelope to burst with a loud ripping noise.
