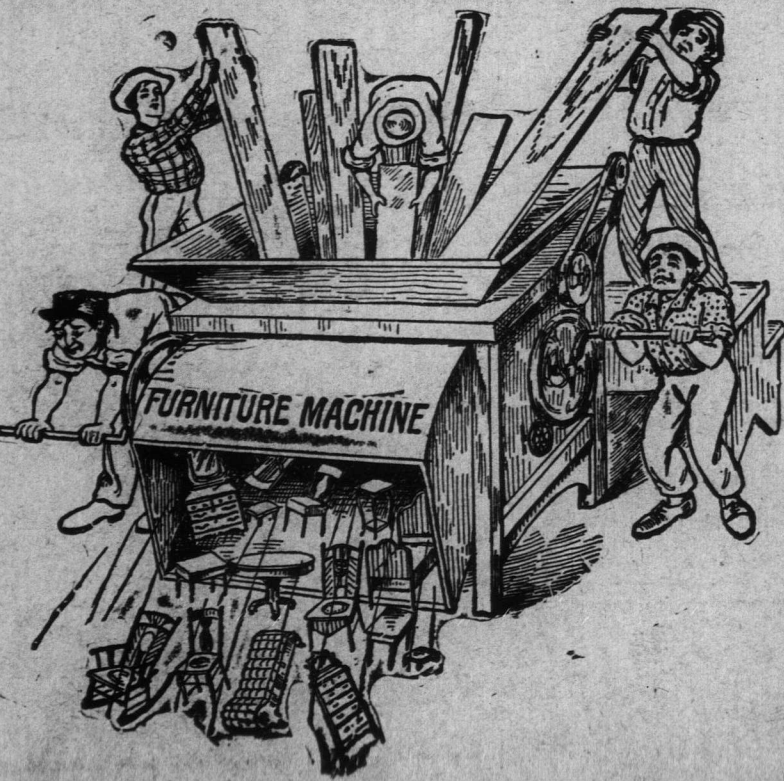

Full Moon—2nd

Days Past—310 To Come—54
LAST EXECUTION at Tyburn 1783.
After these executions were carried out outside Newgate Prison. Disgraceful scenes generally accompanied these executions, people making the event a kind of holiday, and in 1868 an Act was passed prohibiting public executions.
LI HUNG CHANG died 1901, aged 78. An astute and enlightened Chinese statesman, who by sheer ability rose from a humble position to be Chief Minister, and exercised almost supreme control for a number of years over the affairs of his native empire.

Days Past—311 To Come—53

22nd Sunday after Trinity.
JOHN MILTON died 1674, aged 66. England's greatest epic poet. Milton's mind combined all the elements of power with every attribute of beauty and benignity. In his youth he was remarkable for his beauty. His eyes even in their darkness were clear, bright, and expressive, with no appearance of blindness. His later years were employed in the composition of Paradise Lost and Paradise Regained. A tomb was erected to his memory in Westminster Abbey in 1737.

LORD LYTTON (Owen Meredith) born 1831. English poet and statesman, was the son of Lord Lytton, the famous novelist. His works were published mostly under the name of "Owen Meredith."

LORD ROTHSCHILD born 1840. The family of Rothschild was founded in 1803 when they lent a great sum of money to the Danish Government and thus started the business of international financiers.
