From September up to December 17th last, 200 millions of herrings were landed at Yarmouth. The record for earnings is held by the drifter Elsie, which has taken over £9,000 worth of fish during the season.

Lowestoft has done equally well. The record held by her best boat consists of herrings to the value of £10 240. Another boat made £9,800, for Superior Service. while three others had about £8,000 apiece. Several fishermen have earned at the rate of over a hundred a month during the three months season, and even the boys have a hun-
