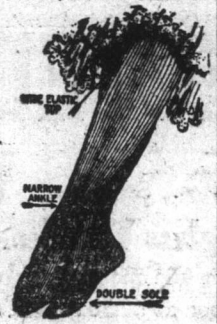

Mainly About People.

Lord Northcliffe, at a recent luncheon given to Dr. Chalmers Mitchell, the London Times' pilot, and his colleagues, said that the next war will be fought on land by tanks, accompanied by airplanes; at sea by submarines; also accompanied by airplanes.

Thomas A. Edison, who has patented hundreds of devices that the average man never even heard of, is said to consider the following as his most important inventions: Quadruple telegraph, incandescent light, phonograph, motion pictures, a telephone transmitter, an electric storage battery and an electric railway.

It is not generally known that, as a matter of precaution, King George's detective is in his entourage whenever His Majesty fulfils a social or state duty; but even he is recognizable by many—and, needless to say, he is quite unlike the popular conception of a detective.

Paderewski is no longer prime minister of Poland, to be sure; but he still has "a handle to his name." He is now Dr. Paderewski, having been given the degree of LL.D. at Oxford. At the same time and place a famous Greek statesman became Dr. Venizelos.

"If the Hall of Fame wants to be a famous institution, let it inscribe the name of Edwin Booth upon one of its bronze tablets; it can add nothing to his fame," said Julia Matlowe, placing her signature in the lead-off position on the statement urging the candidacy of Booth for a niche in the colonnade reserved for America's famous men.

"Lady Lightweight" is the title that has been bestowed upon herself by Vesta Tilley (Lady de Frece). Her age is fifty-six. "I keep fit," she remarked, "because I've no fads and few vices. An occasional cigarette and—very occasionally—a glass of wine. It is remarkable how well a simple-lifer keeps."

"Charlie" Schwab resembled Andrew Carnegie in his method of choosing his business partners in the Bethlehem Steel Works. He says: "When I took hold of Bethlehem the second time I selected 15 young men right out of the mill and made them my partners. Of the 15 I selected, not one has proved a failure. One of them, F. G. Grace, was a crane fellow at \$75 a month. He is now earning five times as much as any other steel employee in the United States, and is several times a millionaire."

While Mayor Peters, of Boston, was absent in Maine recently on a little vacation, a well known city hall habitue entered the mayor's office and presented Assistant Secretary George Canty with a cow bell. He remarked that he wanted the bell sent to Mayor Peters so the latter could tie it on his wrist, thus providing some means of finding the mayor should the city's chief executive become lost. The donor explained that the use of the bell "might prevent a recurrence of the mayor's mishap last year when he became lost in the fog during the street carmen's strike."

Vilhjalmur Stefansson, the noted Arctic explorer, is visiting his aged mother, who lives near Winnipeg, and to further his plans for establishing a vast reindeer ranch in the Barren Lands. He is said to have obtained all the capital necessary for starting his venture. He has great faith in the future of what is commonly called "the barren North," and says: "The so-called Barren Lands will be developed in time, the same way as all other parts of the continent. There are rich resources, mineral as well as vegetable, and I believe enough reindeer meat can be produced in that country to supply the world."

The farmers of Dutchess county, New York, still tell of the campaign young Franklin Roosevelt—he was just 23—waged for a seat in the State Legislature. It was a whirlwind campaign in small compass. The man who is now Democratic candidate for the vice-presidency of the Republic, spoke to the farmers everywhere, and one of the promises he made was that he would use his influence to have the State establish a standard size for apple barrels. It turned out to be a winning issue.

There will be no one to controvert Right Hon. A. J. Balfour's right to his new title of "our most distinguished bachelor," conferred upon him by the speaker in the House of Commons. But at Westminster he has as rivals several members of both Houses of parliament, notably his "brither Scots," Lord Haldane and Sir Robert Horne. There is in the House of Commons, in the opinion of Sir Donald Maclean, an alarmingly strong leaven of bachelors, of whom the more outstanding are Lord Hugh Cecil and Earl Winterton, not forgetting the prime minister's two able lieutenants, Sir William Sutherland and Sir Philip Sassoon.
