Sealing Voyage Closed.

S.S. RANGER BRINGS IN THE KEY.

S.S. Ranger, Capt. W. Kean, arrived from the icefields on Saturday night, hauling for about 8,000 seals, both old and young. The Ranger was in company with the fleet when the patch was struck, March 27th, but owing to the ice conditions was unable to do much, and since the storm of March 29th, has been steaming about picking up scattered seals. The last few days old harps were numerous, but the bunkers running short of coal, Capt. Kean was unable to follow them and was obliged to abandon the voyage. The crew are all well after the trip, which has been one of the most trying in many years. With the arrival of the Ranger, the sealing voyage for 1921 comes to an end.

Sealing Turnouts.

S.S. Viking finished discharging on Friday evening, turning out as follows: 17,534 young harps, 19 bedlamers, 115 old harps, making a total of 17,668 seals, weighing 335 tons, 5 cwt., 1 qr., 9 lbs. net, valued at \$26,410. The crew of 139 men shared \$62.87 each.

S.S. Terra Nova completed discharging Friday afternoon, turning out 10,314 young harps, 305 bedlamers, 131 old harps, and 4 old hoods, a total of 10,754 seals, weighing 227 tons, 14 cwt, 3 qrs., 11 lbs. net, valued at \$17,761.82. The crew of 150 men shared \$39.20 each.

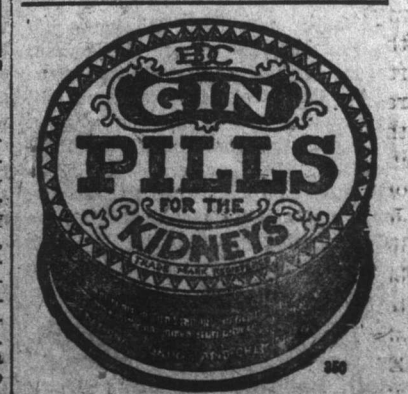
