

The bay is exposed, and when the wind rose Major MacLaren flew his plane a short distance inland, alighting on a body of blackish water known as Totokan Bog. In so doing, according to the sparse population of Urup Island, he courted the malevolence of evil spir-

Totokan Bog is an ill-omented water The natives say it is bottomless, and that no man has ever entered its water and come out alive. CHICAGO, Sept. 15 .- Bishop William Montgomery Brown of Galion, Oh'o, found guilty on a charge of heresy by nine fellow bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church, re-opened his fight to retain his bishopric. Bishop Brown announced he had prepared seven propositions for presentation to the House of Bishops. If the propositions are accepted and he is convinced they are right, he will withdraw his book, "Communism and Christianity" from circulation and renounce his previous assertions and confine his teachings to the seven
