## Local Market.

London, Saturday, Oct. 20.

Grain receipts were light today; the demand for all kinds was steady. Wheat sold at 80c to 85c for red. Only one lot of white offered, the price paid was 85c; quality was poor. On Oct. 19, 1914, wheat was sold at 80c to 85c, one lot of white was sold at 85c, one lot of red at 80c. The supply of almost everything was heavy. Prices were about steady on most lines. Butter, potatoes and onions were lower, the first losing 2c per lb on all grades and makes, and the other two 5c per bag. Cauliflowers, cabbages and turnips were offered in larger quantities than was needed and sold low. Meats steady with a light demand and moderate offering; prices were unchanged. Hay was active and sold freely at 85c to 90c. The supply was light. Quotations:
