

SCOTLAND YARD GRIPS ANARCHISTS

How the "Reds" Are Kept Under Surveillance By London's Detectives.

London, May 2.—The detection of anarchy and anarchy by President Roosevelt, and his recommendation that there should be further repressive legislation dealing with the problem presented by anarchy, will probably increase the effect with which these "anarchists" regard England as a place of domicile.

In this country, however, a silent but keen battle, in which on one side vigilance is never relaxed, is continually going on between Scotland Yard and the foreign and English anarchists who reside in London and the provinces.

The number of anarchists in England, chiefly owing to immigration from other countries, where more stringent police methods prevail, is certainly greater today than was the case a few years ago; but although they are not actively interfering with, practically every man among them, their plans and their movements, are known to the detective officers who belong to what is known as Scotland Yard as the special branch.

In London there are strong colonies, divided into different groups, in Soho and the district abutting on Tottenham Court road, and in the latter of the most important section is the Freedom Group. It publishes a monthly paper called the Freedom, which has a circulation of about 2,000.

Around Soho there are the French, Italian, German and Spanish groups, and in the east end there is a large colony of Jewish anarchists, who possess a clubhouse and publish two journals. The former has a circulation of about 3,000 and the latter of 5,000. Both are printed in Yiddish. There is also a Russian group in the east end. The total membership of the various London groups is between 3,000 and 4,000. Groups have also been established in 29 provincial towns, including Liverpool, Leeds, Sheffield, Hull, Norwich, Birmingham, Manchester, Swansea, Glasgow and Edinburgh.

The arrangements made by the special branch at Scotland Yard to shadow the anarchists are most elaborate. Every anarchist arriving in England is met and identified at the airport or at the London terminal.

So exhaustive are the precautionary measures that it may be said with confidence that there is not a single anarchist group in this country which does not number in its ranks one or more members who are police informants.

60,000 LAYMEN WALK

Monster Parade Brings to Conclusion New York's Catholic Celebration.

New York, May 2.—Sixty thousand Roman Catholic laymen marching in procession this forenoon brought to a climax and to the close of the week-long celebration of the centenary of the founding of the Roman Catholic Diocese of New York. The parade had been looked forward to as the crowning public event of the week and in every way anticipation was surpassed. No more perfect day could have favored the event. The sky was almost cloudless, the air clear and bracing. Along Fifth avenue, and through Fifty-Seventh street, where the line of march led to the dispersing point, hundreds of thousands of persons were massed, and the immense reviewing stand which had been erected in front of the cathedral made a picture the like of which was seldom seen. It had been built to accommodate 2,500 persons, and its whole capacity was placed at the disposal of women and children and the distinguished prelates who have been participating in the observance of the centenary. Of all the sixty thousand who took part in the parade, every man, save Brigadier-General Thomas Barry, the grand marshal, was on foot. Behind him trudged the thousands, millionaires and laborer. Many of the large stores and other business places conducted by Catholics had declared a half-holiday for today that their employees might have an opportunity to take part in the parade, to join with other thousands who crowded the streets to review the marchers. The parade formed at Washington Square, well down toward the lower end of the city and moved up Fifth avenue past the cathedral, and to Fifty-Seventh street, where it was dispersed. The line of march covered a distance of approximately three miles.

GHOSTLY REGULATORY

A MUSICAL MONK WHO CAME BACK ANNUALLY TO ROUEN CATHEDRAL.

There is a story that in the Cathedral of Rouen, years ago, the ghost of a monk played the organ once a year, on All Saints' eve. No one was visible, but the fine old organ was played. At last the ghost was exorcised by bell, book and candle, greatly to the relief of the fleshly organist and his carnal choiristers.
