Port, in addition to some smaller craft.

"We need a hatchery here very badly," said Mr. Nate Cornell, one of the prominent fishermen of the Port. "Practically every port on the American side has a hatchery, and they are putting millions of fish into the lake every year. We have but one hatchery, that at Sandwich. The beneficial results of that are very evident. Four years ago we caught few whitefish. Now we make fine catches, and these fish evidently came from the hatchery. If we had a big hatchery here the business of fishing would boom. We could take a million dollars' worth of fish from the lake each year. That business is worth something, I am sure. It is not the fish that is taken from the lake that depletes it, as paradoxical as it may seem. When the fish are full-grown and matured it would be better if they were taken out, as they leave the feeding grounds for smaller fish. What really depletes the lake is the fact that the young fish are not reproduced in sufficiently large quantities. If we had a hatchery, we could overcome that. We have every kind of spawn here, and it would be no trouble whatever to obtain a sufficient supply."

A Tug Bought.
Mr. Cornell has just purchased a big tug from Collingwood, and Mr. Stanton has purchased a tug somewhat smaller. They are fine additions to the fishing fleet at the Port.

Strathroy's Case.

The report was adopted without discussion.

JUDGMENT RESERVED IN COUNTY COURT CASE

No Decision Yesterday in the Case of Daunt vs. Fisher.

Judge Macbeth reserved judgment in the county court case of Fisher vs. Daunt, which came before him yesterday.

The evidence was all taken in the surrogate case of Daunt vs. Fisher, but the matter will come up again in July. Margaret Fisher and George Hagaray, executors of the estate of William George Fisher, and six children of the late William Fisher and Margaret Fisher, brought action against Charlotte Daunt, sister of the late William Fisher.

The plaintiff's claim sets forth that William Fisher jointly owned part of lot 20, first range north of Longwoods road. He purchased the interests of his four brothers, giving them in return mortgages on the land which were made payable at the death of their mother.

In his last will and testament the late William Fisher left an insurance policy of \$1,000 to his mother, the income from which was to go to her for life, and at her death the principal was to be used for paying off the mortgage. During her life, his widow was to have the benefit of his real and personal estate, and at her death to be sold and the proceeds divided evenly among the children.

After the death of William George Fisher it is stated that Rachel Fisher, his mother, lived with her daughter, Mrs. Daunt, whom, it is alleged, induced her mother to withdraw \$200 from the principal held in trust, and devoted this sum to the use of the defendant and her husband.

At the death of Mrs. Fisher, the mortgages were paid off as provided in the will. The \$200 alleged to have been withdrawn was deducted from Mrs. Daunt's share.

Mrs. Daunt gave notice to the plaintiffs of her intention to sell the property, having first claim to it by reason of her mortgage. It is to recover the \$200 or have the mortgage cancelled that the action has been entered. Macpherson & Perrin, for the plaintiff; Ross & Bixell, for the defendant.

A FARMING EXPERT FOR LAMBTON COUNTY

The Council Appropriates Five Hundred Dollars for the Purpose.

[Special to The Advertiser.]

Sarnia, Ont., June 10.—One of the most interesting debates that has taken place for many seasons of the county council was heard at the afternoon session of the council held here yesterday afternoon when the subject of granting an appropriation for an agricultural expert for the county was brought up. Many of the councillors who did not thoroughly understand the meaning of the term were at first opposed to the granting of any sum for such a purpose, but after hearing the able explanations offered by their colleagues, who were more thoroughly acquainted with the question, their opinions were gradually changed, and after a lively debate lasting about an hour, the report of the special committee recommending that an appropriation of \$500 be made for the appointment of an agricultural expert, was carried, with scarcely a dissenting voice. The agricultural expert will be a paid official of the Government, and the \$500 granted will be used towards defraying the expenses of conducting experiments throughout the county. Farmers in Lambton County will not now require to send their sons to an agricultural college, while they can learn the methods of higher farming, as an agricultural expert will have a thorough knowledge of all branches of agriculture, including the drainage problem. The county council is to be congratulated on the forward step they have taken, and in a very few years there should be a marked difference in the appearance of the farms and orchards in Lambton County.

BOTHWELL MAN WAS DETERMINED TO DIE

Weights His Pockets Wades Into Thames and Is Drowned.

Thamesville, Ont., June 10.—A deliberate case of suicide took place here yesterday, when Robert Trot, from near Bothwell, after spending the night with a man by the name of Thomas here, left his place about 12 o'clock, and walked straight to the River Thames, a half-mile below the town, and, with weights in his pockets, waded into the centre of the stream, and sank.

Mrs. Harris, who lives on the river bank, heard the dogs making a noise, and on going out saw Trot in the centre of the river, and he immediately sank out of sight. Upon giving the alarm a large number of people soon gathered, and boys, with fishing lines, began dragging the river. The body was soon dragged ashore, but life was extinct.

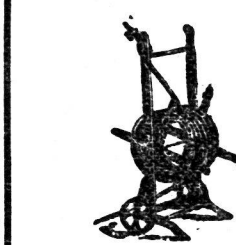
