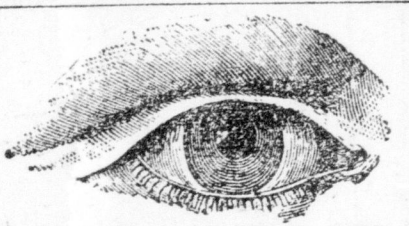

**DEATH TRAPS**

**AT CITY HALL**

No Fire Escapes in the Spencer  
Block in the Event of a  
Blaze.

**CITY BREAKING BY LAW**

Absence of fire escapes on the new  
city hall quarters in the Spencer  
Block have been provoking consider-  
able discussion lately, and there is a  
possibility that the city of London  
may find itself in police court one of  
these days on a charge of breaking  
one of its own bylaws—to wit, the  
provision of necessary fire escapes.

The Spencer Block is four stories  
high. The janitor will have quarters  
on the top floor, while committee  
rooms, the council chamber, the asso-  
ciated charities, the Humane Society,  
and other offices have their quarters  
on the third. In the event of fire  
breaking out the top floors would be  
veritable death traps. If the probable  
fire occurred during day time, the  
account of the various offices on the  
third floor would be endangered. If  
it were at night the custodian and the  
portly aldermen would face the  
alternative of being roasted or else  
dropping two floors to the roof of the  
adjoining building.

No Soft Spots.  
From neither front nor rear is the  
"jump" an inviting one. The asphalt  
pavement and cinder sidewalks of the  
front are hardly places for "jumping"  
that would be welcomed by even the  
aldermen. At the back, the soft  
spots are even harder to find. A drop  
from the rear windows would mean a  
fall of an extra story, for there is a  
big area that practically covers the  
entire space to the rear of the struc-  
ture.

The vaults, that have been built to  
the rear of the Spencer Block, might  
prove temporary havens of refuge if  
anyone were able to make his way to  
the top of this vault addition, but the  
airy perch is at best far from invit-  
ing.

Friday night some of the aldermen  
were conjecturing how they would  
escape from the third floor in case of  
fire, and there is a possibility that  
these nervous individuals will see to  
it that fire escapes are provided for a  
more dignified exit than jumping.

At the next meeting of the police  
commissioners a suggestion to the ef-  
fect that an addition to the present  
police station be made, or that new  
quarters be selected, will be made by  
one of the members.

The police station is inadequate to  
house the constables, and is in such an  
unsanitary condition that many of the  
men have been forced to go home on  
account of illness contracted through  
conditions existing at the court house.

The constables' room, downstairs, is  
altogether too small for the number of  
men who congregate there at times to  
eat their meals or to wait for their  
turn to take their "beats." The detec-  
tives' room is also too small, and has  
absolutely no ventilation, while the  
police office, which is the brightest room  
in the whole building, is sadly lacking  
in the amount of the equipment which is seen  
in even the most unpretentious office of a  
side street warerooms.

The courtroom, the magistrate's of-  
fice, the chief office, is in the same  
condition, and is in the same condition,  
and as the board has to force the city  
to make any repairs, it is likely that  
a suggestion to the effect that an addi-  
tion be built to the station will be sent  
to the council.

A request for a small automobile for  
the detective department will also be  
discussed.

The detectives often have calls to  
places within a short time after noti-  
fication. At present they have to de-  
pend upon street cars.
