THE FEELING IS UNSETTLED.

RAILWAY STOCKS ARE FIRMER ON WALL-STREET.

Local Securities Quiet—Large Increase in Visible Supply of Wheat—Speculators Waiting for Government Report—Amount of Wheat and Corn Afloat—Provisions Again Higher at Chicago. Monday Evening, Sept. 10. Silver bullion is 1-16 higher in London to-day, at 29 1/2-100 per ounce.

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Imports into the United Kingdom the past week: Wheat, 242,000 qrs.; maize, 92,000 qrs.; flour, 249,000 barrels. Corn afloat to Europe is 3,422,000 bushels, a decrease of 176,000 for the week.

Money Markets.

The local money market is unchanged at 4 1/2 per cent. for call loans. At London the rate is 1-4 and at New York 1 per cent. The Bank of England discount rate is 2 and the open market rate 9-16 per cent.
