

The Agreement Between the Dominion of Canada and
The Irish Free State

Majesty's Government in the Dominion of Canada and His Majesty's
Government in the Irish Free State desiring to facilitate and extend still further
the mutual relations of trade and commerce, have agreed upon the following

ARTICLE I

Goods, the produce or manufacture of Canada, imported into the Irish
State, shall not be subject to other or higher duties than those paid on
goods, the produce or manufacture of any other country.

ARTICLE II

Goods, the produce or manufacture of the Irish Free State, imported into
Canada, shall not be subject to other or higher duties than those paid on similar
goods, the produce or manufacture of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and
Ireland.

ARTICLE III

This Agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Parliaments of the
Dominion of Canada and of the Irish Free State. Upon approval being given
by both Governments, it shall be in force from the date of its coming into force and the
expiration of six months from the date on which either Government
shall give to the other notice of its intention to terminate the Agreement.

and thirty-two.
