

4. The Ukrainian Catholic Episcopal Corporation of Saskatchewan:

The diocese sought to be incorporated comprises the Province of Saskatchewan and those areas of the Northwest Territories lying immediately north of the said province. It is deemed desirable by the petitioner to be incorporated without delay in the best interests of the temporal affairs of the diocese, notwithstanding the fact that the authority required from Rome was received too late to permit of presenting a petition within the first six weeks of the session.

5. Flora Muriel Crane Keane (Divorce):

The alleged offence occurred on March 16, four days after the time allowed for the presentation of petitions had expired. The petitioner is obliged to maintain herself; and representations made to your Committee are to the effect that, as a result of her domestic situation, her health has suffered to such an extent that she is in danger of losing her employment.

Your Committee recommends that Standing Orders 92 and 93(a) and (c) be suspended in relation to each of the above petitions and that they be read and received.

6. Eva Lubin Greenfield (Divorce):

The Parliamentary Agent for the petitioner having requested leave to withdraw this petition, your Committee recommends accordingly.

2. How many employees are on the present staff of the Printing Bureau?

3. (a) Where will the Bureau secure its new employees?

(b) Does it propose to train them, or depend upon hiring workers from private plants?

4. How do Bureau rates of pay compare with commercial scales elsewhere?

5. Is it proposed to have sufficient employees to meet Government printing at times of peak requirements?
