PRAYERS

Mr. Trudeau, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid upon the Table,—Copies of Agenda for the Constitutional Conference, June 14-16, 1971. (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 283-5/1.

Pursuant to Standing Order 39(4), the following Question was made an Order of the House for a Return:

No. 1,248—*Mr. Yewchuk*

1. For the 1971 Census of Agriculture (a) how many questionnaires will be used (b) how many questions will be asked?
2. How many and which rural areas were chosen to test the draft agricultural questionnaire in the Fall of 1968?
3. For the Agriculture quality check program (a) what percentage of all census-farms will be re-enumerated (b) what will be the area sample (c) what will be the questions?
4. For the 1971 Census of Canada will the government hire university students as numerators and, if so, how many?—Sessional Paper No. 283-2/1,248.

Mr. Mahoney, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Finance, presented,—Return to the foregoing Order.

Bill C-219, An Act to establish the Canada Development Corporation, as reported (with amendments) from the Standing Committee on Finance, Trade and Economic Affairs, was again considered at the report stage.

Whereupon, the House resumed debate on the motion of Mr. Lewis for Mr. Saltsman, seconded by Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre),—That Bill C-219, An Act to establish the Canada Development Corporation, be amended by deleting from Clause 6 lines 34 to 36 and substituting the following:

“and shall be carried out in the best interests of the people of Canada.”

And on the motion of Mr. Lewis for Mr. Burton, seconded by Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre),—That Bill C-219, An Act to establish the Canada Development Corporation, be amended by deleting paragraph (b) of subclause 2 of Clause 6.

And on the motion of Mr. Lewis for Mr. Saltsman, seconded by Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre),—That Bill C-219, An Act to establish the Canada Development Corporation, be amended by substituting in Clause 7(1) paragraphs (d), (e) and (f) the words “Canadian nation” for the word “company” in lines 9, 19 and 23 on page 5.
