THE period for which I have had the Honor to be elected to serve you in the House of Assembly being about to expire, and having been requested by many of you to propose myself at the approaching GENERAL ELECTION, I take the liberty of announcing publicly my intention to be a Candidate for your suffrages.

Having been amongst the earliest Settlers in the County of Middlesex, and witnessed, with all of you, the rapid progress of its improvement, amidst the active employments in which we have been engaged, I have great satisfaction in the contemplation of our good prospects for the future, and can truly say, that nothing can contribute more to my happiness than the prosperity of this County.
