"Sureties."

(39) "sureties" means sufficient sureties, and the expression "security" means sufficient security; and, whenever these words are used, one person is sufficient therefor, unless otherwise expressly required; 10

"Telecommunication."

(40) "telecommunication" means any transmission, emission or reception of signs, signals, writing, images or sounds or intelligence of any nature by wire, radio, visual or other electromagnetic system;

"Two justices."

(41) "two justices" means two or more justices of the peace, assembled or acting together; 15

"United Kingdom."

(42) "United Kingdom" means the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland;

"United States."

(43) "United States" means the United States of America; 20

"Writing."

(44) "writing", or any term of like import, includes words printed, typewritten, painted, engraved, lithographed, photographed, or represented or reproduced by any mode of representing or reproducing words in visible form; and 25

"Year."

(45) "year" means any period of twelve consecutive months, except that a reference to a "calendar year" means a period of twelve consecutive months commencing on the first day of January and a reference by number to a Dominical year means the period of twelve consecutive months commencing on the first day of January of that year. 30

"Minister of Finance."

29. The expression "Minister of Finance" or "Receiver General" in an enactment or document means the Minister of Finance and Receiver General, and the expression "Deputy Minister of Finance" or "Deputy Receiver General" in an enactment or document means the Deputy Minister of Finance and Receiver General. 35

"Telegraph."

30. The expression "telegraph" and its derivatives in an enactment or in an Act of the legislature of any province enacted before that province became part of Canada on any subject that is within the legislative powers of the Parliament of Canada, shall be deemed not to include the word "telephone" or its derivatives. 40

31. The name commonly applied to any country, place, body, corporation, society, officer, functionary, person, party or thing, means the country, place, body, corporation, society, officer, functionary, person, party or thing to which 45
