The sole head of a family, or any mai over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alland in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions. onaitions.

A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, on certain conditions.
