One of the Leaders in the Attacks Ra Minister Who Does Not Believe in the Divinity of the Saviour.

The subject which is uppermost in the minds of all Catholics at the present moment, the recent eucharistic congress at Montreal, was chosen by the Rev. L. Minehan of St. Peter's Church, as the topic for his sermon yesterday morning.

He painted in graphic colors the grand scene at Montreal. The vivifying presence of Jesus Christ had drawn hundreds of thousands to a great city, just as they had been drawn to another 19 centuries and It was to another 19 cen other 19 centuries ago. It was a wor ful contrast between the scenes de-scribed in St. Paul's epistles and those

of the last week.

Never in history had mass been said in grander surroundings. Never before had human eyes witnessed such a scene, since the mountain raised its scene, since the mountain raised its head above the flood; never had the world seen such a religious demonstration. The crowning event was the procession, held on Sunday. Along the route the people were gathered 18 deep on either side, and when, towards evening, they grouped around the blazing repository, between four and five hundred thousand were present. Over all, the moon hung, softly shining like a senetuary lamp. And Jesus was the

the moon hung, softly shining like a sanctuary lamp. And Jesus was the central object of this wonderful demonstration. Everyone of the half million bent low in His presence, and blended memories of His power and His love surged thru the multitude. Carlyle said that there was always one dark spot in a man's sunshine, and that was his own shadow. There was a shadow in everything, and this had been no exception. At the meetings of the congress not one uncharitable word had been said; every sentence had immediate reference to the love of word had been said; every sentence had immediate reference to the love of Jesus Christ, and how Catholics could make best use of that love. But a couple of words, uttered before the meetings began, had been caught up and twisted. When the papers came out last Monday morning, one was reminded of the chorus of demons in Cardinal Newman's poem of "The Dream of Gerontius."
