

Mining Market Strong at Week End--Pearl Lake Advances

WHEAT PRICES DECLINE DESPITE CROP DAMAGE

Young Man, Right Clothes Mean Much to You

PEARL LAKE IS UP ON NEWS OF BIG STRIKE

The Heavy World's Shipments Anticipated and Increase in Visible Supply More Than Offset News of Field Injuries.

CHICAGO, Sept. 22.—The wheat market this side of the Canadian border and crop damage across that line proved insufficient today to offset in the wheat market the bearish effect of expected heavy world shipments and an anticipated increase in visible supply. Closing prices were easy, 1-5c to 1-6c under last night's. The market in corn varied from 1-3c decline to 1-4c advance. Oats finished 1-8c to 1-4c off to 3-4c up, and provisions less costly by a shade to 1-2c.

Cold, wet weather in the northwest brought about a mid-season rally in the wheat market, but at other times the prevailing influence came from the disappointing cables and from the rapid rate at which primary receipts were piling in. Exporters were unanimous that foreign business was out of the question with even a further break of 1-2c.

Country elevator holdings of wheat in the Dakotas and Minnesota appeared more than ample to aver any stoppage in the crop movement even though the harvest suffered no inconvenience by unfavorable conditions. Weakness of the corn market also hindered the wheat bulls.

Abundant pasturage until snowfall was said to have been assured by general rains last night and today. As a result, corn prices were not so badly punished of late to do much harm.

Oats displayed more strength than any other grain. September shorts were covering in a lively manner and shipping demand was good.

Provisions sagged owing to the improved outlook for fall feed.
