THAT HUDSON'S BAY LINE

G. T. Pacific Not Uniting With Any Other Road to Build. -

Ottawa, Aug. 29.—One of the leading officials of the Grand Trunk Pacific Company declared today that there is not the least foundation for the report published by a Winnipeg paper about the G. T. R. and the C. N. R. having entered into a joint agreement for the construction of the Hudson Bay Railway. Both companies have charter powers to undertake this work, and the Canadian Northern. indeed, has a considerable stretch of line

already constructed in that direction. There is a Dominion subsidy available of 6,400 acres per mile along the portion of the Hudson Bay road that would pass through Manitoba, and 12.800 acres for the portion through the territories. This is still open to any company that undertakes

the enterprise.

As already said, the Canadian Northern has a portion of the line now constructed, and publicly announced their intention of completing the undertaking without delay. In the meantime, Messrs. Mackenzie & Mann have been endeavoring, so far with out success, to induce the Federal Government to change the present subsidy, so Telephone 1277.
