PENALTY FOR RECKLESS DRIVING OF MOTOR CARS NOW INCREASED

Changes Made in Act During 1919 Session of Legislature.

At the 1919 session of the Ontario Leg-islature the following important changes the muncipality. were made in the motor vehicles act:
