The Town, however, does not wish to bear the cost of the work and would at least like to have the Railway pay a proportionate part of the same. If you can give me any further information showing whether the Town is Junior or Senior to the Railway, the same will be appreciated.

I have retained the Finger Lumber Company Plan sent me by you, as possibly the same matter will have to be threshed out with the Railway Company regarding the Eastern portion of the Town.
