KILDONA HAS BROKEN UP

Only a Few Bits of Broken Wreckage Remain to Tell the Story. The Thomson line steamer Kildona, which went on Brazil rock, at Cape Sable, Saturday morning, was broken up by Sunday's storm and has disappeared and only a few bits of floating wreckage are left near the spot to tell the disaster.

Mr. Schofield said the only conclusion to be arrived at was that the Kildona had been broken to pieces and sunk. Captain Roberts was seen in the office of the Kildona Co. He seemed weary and protested that he was nearly "off his feet" in his effort to care for his men.

BUOY WAS NOT WORKING WELL

Two Pilots Give Evidence to Its Effect in Yarmouth Enquiry. The enquiry into the circumstances surrounding the stranding of the D. A. R. steamer Yarmouth on the Rock Islands, near Misep, was resumed in the customs house yesterday afternoon before F. J. Harding, agent of the department of marine and fisheries.

Mr. Harding, commenting on the evidence of the pilots, said the only way the department could keep the buoys in order was for pilots and others to report any defects. He had no record on file that this buoy was not working.
