The returned missionaries present were introduced and accorded the usual privileges of the Convention, the same courtesy being extended to Mrs. Gordon Grant, of Victoria, B.C.

The Field Corresponding Secretary, Home Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer presented their annual reports. The annual membership is now 14,229—increase, 322; life-members, 842—increase, 58; Mission Band members, 6,476; total receipts, \$39,016.22—increase, \$1,354.36,

Mrs. Briggs presented the report of the Supply Committee.

The report of the Executive Committee, comprising the full text of the interim minutes, was read and adopted.

The Branch Corresponding Secretaries presented reports from their respective Branches, the Home Corresponding Secretary reporting for the separate Auxiliaries of Newfoundland.
