

## MANY PEOPLE VISIT ALMA TO INSPECT FIRE DEVASTATION

Nearly Half a Hundred Residents Homeless and Nigh Disheartened

HOPKINSON HILL, June 6.—Hundreds of visitors, some of them coming from long distances, motored to Alma today to view the ruins caused by the recent disastrous fire which laid in ashes 24 buildings including 10 residences, four stores, the school house and the Methodist church. The Sabbath as it dawned found a stricken village and a sorrowful and well nigh disheartened people with half a hundred residents homeless and the outlook for restoration not encouraging. Many of the residents feel that with the present poor industrial conditions of this one time busy locality, the prospects of the village ever recovering from the disaster are not bright. So far the homeless are being given shelter in the village. It was impossible today to get a correct statement of the individual losses or insurance held. Some buildings are not insured at all and others only for small amounts. There was \$1,000 on the Methodist church and \$1,500 on the school house. Councillor J. A. Cleveland, whose residence, one of the finest in the county, was destroyed, has moved into the White bungalow. A number of Saint John insurance men are on the scene checking up on the losses.

## Fishway to Be Constructed On Magaguadavic River Soon

Tenders Now Being Called For: River Stocked With Salmon

ST. GEORGE, June 6.—Tenders are being called for the construction of a fishway at the falls on the Magaguadavic, and it is expected work will start with the low run of water. The river has been pronounced by experts one of the best in the province for salmon, and the fishway will give these ganey fish a chance to get to their natural spawning grounds. Smelt, gaspereau and other salt water citizens are expected to make use of the road to the beds of streams where they may propagate their species.

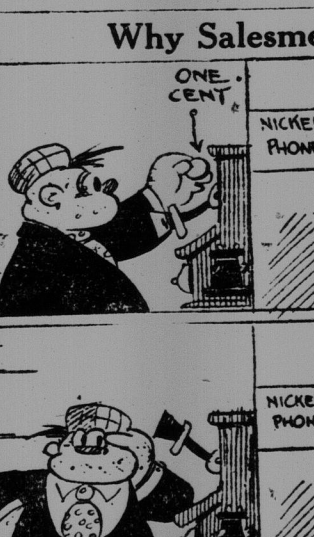
