Ramsay MacDonald Explains Why He Opposes Baldwin Mine Settlement

SAYS CIRCUMSTANCES OF ACTION OMINOUS

Ramsay MacDonald, first Labor premier of England, explains in an article in "The Nation" why he opposes Premier Baldwin's coal subsidy. Mr. MacDonald thinks this subsidy, intended to provide a living wage for coal miners, is an encouragement to violent revolution.

"The country," he says, " is mingling trembling with its dissatisfaction, and well it may, for the circumstances attending this dispute and its settlement are ominous. For at least 12 months this coming clash was apparent."


